

KEYNOTE: Navigating Conflict as a Leader Karen Cornell DVM, PhD, DACVS Associate Dean for Professional Programs—Texas A&M School of Veterinary Medicine &

Dr. Cornell graduated from the Purdue University College of Veterinary Medicine in 1988 and practiced for two years in southern Indiana before returning to Purdue to complete a small animal rotating internship, small animal surgical residency and a Ph.D. in cancer biology. She then began her career as an academic faculty member at the University of Georgia, College of Veterinary Medicine. During her 18 years at UGA, Dr. Cornell served as the Chief of Staff for Surgery, the assistant department head in the Department of Small Animal Medicine and Surgery, the Interim Director of the Teaching Hospital, the Director of Continuing Education and the Associate Dean of Academic Affairs. In 2012, Dr. Cornell was chosen as a fellow in the Southeastern Conference Academic Leadership Development Program and participated in the yearlong leadership-training program.

In addition to her leadership roles within the UGA College of Veterinary Medicine, she has served as the chair of the American College of Veterinary Surgeons Examination Committee, a member of the ACVS Ad Hoc Residency Requirements Implementation Committee, the ACVS Examination Restructuring Committee, as a member of the Board of Regents, and as President and Chair of the Board of Regents for the same organization. She served as the President of the International Veterinary Communication Institute

for 3 years and as a member of the Board of Directors for the Veterinary Leadership Institute for 10 years. She was a member of the first group of veterinary faculty who attended communication skills training at the Institute for Healthcare Communication (IHC) in New Haven Connecticut in 2003. Since that time, she has served as a lead facilitator for the train-the-trainer program taught each year by IHC and in this role has trained over 330 veterinary faculty from 36 veterinary schools. As a consultant for the IHC, Dr. Cornell has developed and delivered educational materials regarding communication within veterinary teams, disclosure of medical errors, delivering feedback and conflict resolution. In addition to her communication skills training and facilitation experience she has completed the Myers & Briggs Type Indicator certification program enabling her to administer the MBTI instrument and the Emotional Intelligence Training Certification course. In 2013, she attended Relational Coordination Intervention training which instructs individuals on the use of the relational coordination survey instrument to assess and improve collaboration and performance across work groups.

Over the course of her career Dr. Cornell has received numerous awards including the Josiah Meigs Distinguished Teaching Professorship, the highest award for teaching at the University of Georgia. She is a two-time recipient of the Carl J Norden/Pfizer/ Zoetis Distinguished Teaching Award and in 2011 she received the National Student AVMA Community Outreach Excellence Award. In 2022, she received the Texas A&M Association of Former Students' Distinguished Achievement Award for Administration and the John J. Koldus, III Faculty and Staff Achievement Award from the Division of Student Affairs.

Dr. Cornell is committed to helping to improve the veterinary profession through the training of veterinary professionals in the essential professional skills of leadership and communication.
